EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT Andrew Revell

Welcome to my review of 2022.



A busy year which started with another office move to larger premises at Blackwell Business Park as the likelihood of returning to the Ellen Badger Hospital began to diminish. As usual the team rallied to make the move as painless as possible and obviously there was no disruption to our Nursing service.

During the year we looked after 180 patients and spent nearly 7,600 hours providing care for them. Many of the patients we cared for had complex, and or multiple illnesses requiring more intervention from us prior to the end of their lives.

In August 2022 we reorganised our Nursing team so that we were able to operate three scheduled shifts daily. During the day we have a minimum of two care staff from 0800-2000, a minimum of one member of staff at night, plus a 24-hour Nurse coordinator on call for telephone support and emergency patient visits. Our new way of working allows

us to be more integrated with other stakeholders and improves the continuity of the care we provide. In addition, we have been accepted as a provider by NHS Continuing Healthcare to support end of life patients with packages of care with the aim of improving the overall patient and family care experience.

The Health and Care Act 2022 is also making major changes to the NHS to develop Integrated Care Systems to bring together NHS, local authority and third sector bodies to take on responsibility for the resources and health of an area or 'system'. Their aim is to deliver more integrated care for patient. With this change in mind, we have been working with other Warwickshire Hospices for the last 18 months to develop a hospice 'offer' at county level to ensure there is easy and equitable access for all patients and families where and when they need a hospice service. This collaborative approach will not impact the individual identity or operation of each hospice but should improve

the way we work together and allow patients to access more end of life services.

The feedback we receive from patients and those close to them continues to be very favourable and, at a time where the pressures on the NHS continue to grow, the role of Hospices is increasingly relevant and important in the overall healthcare system. Individually and as a Coventry and Warwickshire group of hospices we continue to work with our service Commissioners and the Integrated Care Board (previously the CCG) to promote the awareness of the importance of a robust hospice service.

We continue to be financially healthy, with income of £831, 042 for the financial year ending 30 June 2022 which was a positive variance of over £150,000 on the previous financial year. In addition to the ongoing loyal support of our donors, local businesses, and trust funds we received an unexpected total of £450,000 in grant income from the NHS England Covid and Winter Pressures fund via Hospice UK. Event based fundraising income returned to pre-covid levels with income of £54,408. Costs have increased aligned to the increase in nursing hours over the period.

Rebecca Mawle our Head of Community Fundraising retired in September 2022 after 25 years of building the awareness, income, and profile of the charity. We are delighted that Rebecca has agreed to continue to work with us as an Honorary Ambassador.

We were fortunate that Kate Bamford, an existing, relatively new member of the team was able to take on more responsibility and become our new Fundraising and Communications Manager. Allison Allen joined us from Dogs for Good in September and brings with her over 15 years of charity experience - I have high hopes for this formidable team!

Jo Sweby also joined us in February 2022 as our Trust and Grants Fundraising Manager and, despite working only one day a week, has generated nearly £54,000 in the 11 months she has been with us.

Operational initiatives to improve efficiency continued to be a theme for the year with the implementation of Beacon (a Donor Relationship Management platform) being the most resource intensive. This implementation was completed in July and will allow us to segment and streamline our communication with donors and supporters.

In October we were nominated for the Stratford Herald Business and Tourism Charity of the Year award and were delighted to be chosen as the winner from three other high profile and worthy finalists.

Also, in October we welcomed our new Chair of Trustees, David Morris. David replaced Dr Clive Irwin who retired as Chair but has agreed to remain a trustee and Chair of the Clinical sub-Committee. Clive retires with my personal thanks for his support and guidance, and I now look forward to working with David.

Finally, without the unfailing support and commitment of our donors, volunteers, staff, and trustees we would cease to exist so once again a big thank for your efforts, thoughtfulness, and support of this essential community service.

I returned home to South Warwickshire in 2012 after spending 18 years in Cornwall, London, Cambridgeshire and overseas. During this time, I trained as a nurse, undertook a law degree and then subsequently joined an international professional services firm. I now look after a large team of staff and work with organisations here and overseas identifying and managing financial and operational change. A large percentage of my time is spent working with healthcare organisations and Government agencies.

Shipston Home Nursing has been a high profile and integral part of its community for many years and bridges the gap in palliative care services which the NHS cannot fully provide through its community nursing teams. The team are a cohesive mixture of nursing and care, fundraising and operational staff, all sharing the vision that every adult in our community has access to free, high quality end of life care at home - an ethos that I personally hold very strongly.

My initial impression is that this simple vision



statement underpins all activities of the team and that they are totally focused on providing the best patient and family experience possible, often in very difficult circumstances.

I frequently review comments received from relatives of patients we have cared for and am

heartened to read about their experiences, the ways in which the team have helped and made a difference and very occasionally how we could do things better.

Improving our care services is always at the forefront of our minds and I would welcome any ideas you may have to help us achieve this.

We simply could not function without the incredible support we receive from our community - from the volunteers who generously provide their time and energy to support our community events to those of you who donate to us monthly, or through your businesses or Trust Funds you are associated with. My grateful thanks go to you all.

This year we anticipate an increase in our costs mainly due to the challenging economic circumstance but also as we try to encourage more patient referrals from our healthcare partners and families themselves. We will also be looking to expand our service offerings to ensure we deliver the very support needed to our patients and their relatives.

I wish you all a happy and healthy 2023 and thank you again for your ongoing support.

We are looking to expand our team further this year and will

be offering a more extensive bereavement service. We want to be able to offer extra support from our nursing team but also specialist bereavement support if required.

It is a privilege caring for people at the end of their lives, within their homes and this year we have supported more patients and families than ever. The nursing team never cease to amaze me with their care and support of our patients, often going above and beyond to ensure everyone gets the highest quality care at the most difficult of times. I am immensely proud to be part of such a skilled and dedicated team.

SUE'S STORY

"IT'S LIKE SHIPSTON HOME NURSING WRAPPED A BLANKET AROUND OUR FAMILY IN THE VERY DARKEST OF DAYS," SAID JO CARROLL, WHOSE MOTHER SUE SADLY PASSED AWAY IN AUGUST 2022.

Sue was an active and healthy 78-year-old, until she suddenly became ill in April 2022. After a series of tests, she was diagnosed with multiple cancers (brain, bowel, liver and lung) and was sent home from Warwick Hospital, with the news that she had "days – at best weeks" left. Her cancer was so advanced palliative care was the only option.

Jo, who runs Winchcombe Farm with husband Steve Taylor, said: "We were in complete shock. It's difficult to recall the feeling of utter devastation and the helplessness of not knowing what to do and where to go for help. We all knew what the final outcome was going to be but had no idea of how we would survive the journey."

It was the latest bitter blow in a what has been a difficult year for the family. In the same month as Sue's diagnosis, they were grieving the loss of Steve's 86-year-old mother, Liz, following her 12-month battle with lung cancer.

Jo, Steve and their two sons were also forced to spend most of the year living in temporary accomodation after a fire ravaged their home in January. Steve collapsed while trying to contain the blaze and suffered a cardiac arrest, going on to have a triple heart bypass.

It was at the suggestion of a friend that Jo, 52, contacted Shipston Home Nursing. She explained: "The nurses and carers team became our 'guardian angels,' helping us every step of the way, and I sincerely believe that we wouldn't have survived this period without them.

"As expected, Mum deteriorated very quickly and our biggest problem became night times – Mum was very restless, couldn't sleep and became very confused as the brain cancer and seizures got worse. She couldn't be left alone. Medication failed to help and we very quickly discovered that even with three of us – Dad, my sister and myself – providing 24-hour care was almost impossible.

"I am self-employed and it was peak season running the holiday lodges so it was impossible just to stop working. I also have young children, one of whom is severely autistic, so already have extensive carer responsibilities. "We tried almost 20 care agencies trying to find a waking carer, but to no avail. Shipston Home Nursing stepped in to help us, providing a carer from 10pm to 7am every night they were able.

"This made the most enormous difference to us – the world is a much better place when



you can have a good night's sleep and at least you feel like you can cope with whatever the next day will throw at you, when you've had some rest."

Shipston Home Nursing has a team of qualified night carers – offering both waking night and sleep in care – which is provided free-of-charge to the user, funded by charity donations. This provides a lifeline to many families who are navigating their way, dealing with a terminally ill relative at home.

The Shipston Home Nursing Team worked alongside the District Nurses to care for Sue in her own home, surrounded by her family, until the day she died, even rushing over on the morning she passed away to remove her cannulas and comfort the family, before she was taken to the Chapel of Rest.

Jo added: "They are amazing people – for all that they do and the difference that they make. Their person-centred approach ensures a seamless service but it's not just about the care, it's the people working for Shipston Home Nursing who are pouring their hearts and souls into their job."

The Carroll family has set themselves a fundraising target of £10,000 to say thank you to Shipston Home Nursing and make sure that other local families can have the same support they received.

They raised just over £7,500 so far, through donations from family and friends and in lieu of flowers at Sue's funeral.

Sue's seven-year-old grandson, Bob, recently raised £235 by charging people to sign his plaster cast after breaking his ankle. He said: "I'm really pleased that I've raised such a lot of money for the people that helped my Nanny. My mum and dad are very proud of me and I've been very brave, because it hurt a lot."



Jo added: "Shipston Home Nursing walk alongside many families dealing with terminal illness and can only do that with the continued support of the local community and businesses.

"Both myself and my sister Heidi are going along to their volunteer recruitment night at The George in Shipston on 18th January to see how we can join the fundraising team.

"A good deed brightens a dark world and we can't pay back kindness, but we can pass it on. We pledge to do all that we can to help Shipston Home Nursing continue their invaluable work for local families like ours, who make a difference that is immeasurable in words. For that, we shall be forever grateful".


